


The people in town

Find Sychar on the map



Jesus and the Samaritan Woman: Part 1

Jesus was travelling. He travelled on foot. Jesus went through a town in the region of Samaria. Samaria is in Israel. Many people in Israel were Jews, but the Samaritan people were not Jews. Jews and Samaritans were not friends. Jesus was a Jew.

Jesus stopped at a well to get a drink. There was a Samaritan woman. She was getting water from the well. He asked her, "Will you give me a drink?"

She was surprised he talked to her because she was not a Jew. She told him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?"

Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who I am, you would ask me for a drink. I would give you living water".

The woman said, "Sir, you have no bucket to get water out of the deep well. Where can you get this living water?"

"Jacob gave us this well and he drank from it a long time ago. His sons and his livestock drank from it too. Are you greater than our ancestor Jacob?"

Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again. If you drink the 'living water' I have, you will never be thirsty again. This water will be a spring of eternal life."

The woman said to him, "Sir, give me your water so I won't ever be thirsty again."



Jesus and the Samaritan Woman: Part 2



The woman said to him, "Sir, give me your water so I won't ever be thirsty again."

Jesus told the Samaritan woman, "Go, call your husband and come back."

She said, "I have no husband".

Jesus said, "This is correct. You have no husband. You had five husbands and your current man is not your husband."

She said, "Sir, I can see you are a prophet." Jews say we must worship in Jerusalem. "

In those days, Jews worshiped in the temple in Jerusalem, but Samaritans could not enter.

Jesus told her, "Woman, believe me, a time is coming. You will worship the Father in Spirit and in Truth. This worship pleases God. "

The woman said, "I know that Messiah" (Christ) is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us."

Then Jesus said, "I am He (Messiah/Christ)".

The woman went back to town and told people, "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?"
